
## The Austin Gilbert & Sullivan Society May-June 1989 Newsletter

- Last Meeting: Four members, faithful and true, met for a short supper meeting on Monday, April 3rd at Mother's Cafe, 4215 Duval. They were Michael Drousche, Reba Gillman, Bob Kusnetz and Bob Mellin. Member Ray Howard dropped in briefly to see how things were going.
- In view of the small attendance no earth-shaking decisions were considered. President Bob K. reported that the show was sailing vigorously toward opening night. He also told us about some tentative conversations with Don Toner, of Live Oak Theatre. Don had a time slot vacant toward the end of November, and was interested in working with us on a production then. Bob suggested that we do The Gondoliers, to celebrate its opening one hundred years ago, in November 1889. Live Oak Theatre seats 172 and can expand to seat 200. Bob planned to project ticket sales and prices, and discuss finances with Don soon. Michael suggested that we get our publicity organized well ahead.
- Bob also reported a delightful weekend spent in Virginia with Jim and Dorothy Kellogg. The weather was cold and windy, but the Kelloggs were as warm and inviting as ever. The meeting was adjourned to allow three of those present to get over to the Hyde Park Theatre for the rehearsal of *H.M.S. Pinafore*.

- Notes About The Show: The figures aren't analyzed yet, but we drew good crowds, and enthusiastic responses. Money has come rolling in, from new Members, Patrons, and Lord High Patrons. An equal number have asked to be put on the mailing list, and some have even volunteered to work. As predicted, the last weekend turned into a nightmare of overcrowding ... if only we could have roped in some of those eager patrons for an earlier performance! The Galas went off well ... special thanks to the hard work of Pearl Amster, who organized the food. Our members responded to Pearl's call with a variety of delicious eatables, which Pearl and Enid served up in style as soon as the stage was cleared. Of special note was a wonderfully decorated cake, creation of Diana Sethre. Old friends and new enjoyed the festive occasions.
- We did a radio show at KUT-FM on Tuesday, May 2nd. About half the cast were there to sing almost an hour's worth of excerpts from *H.M.S.Pinafore* with Len accompanying. John Aielli was the host, and Jacki supplied backup material. This wonderful piece of publicity was arranged by Bob Mellin.

She was working for us day and night, rain or shine, at the theater and all over town, arranging things, solving problems, cleaning up bits of business or music, and always cheerily encouraging us on.
