• Last Meeting •

Fourteen people met on Monday, October 7th at the home of Sue Ricket Caldwell. They were members Sue, Karen Collier, Michael Drousche, Norma Garza, Reba Gillman, Loel Graber, Enid Hallock (with guest, Gary Hallock), Carla Hammock, Bob Kusnetz, Allen Lawshae, Robert Mellin, Juanita Robbins (returned from Dallas), and Anne Smith.

Allen reported that he had talked with Connie Barr, Assistant Principal at Reagan H.S., about our Adopt-A-School project. He asked for volunteers to work with him.

Karen reported that we have signed a contract with ZSTC to rent their Kleberg Theatre space in June 1992 for our production of *Mikado*. Some problems about insurance have to be worked out.

Karen reported that in addition to reservations for the October 13th Tea, we had received \$135 in donations. Reba reported that she had received a letter from a member sugggesting that \$25 per person was too much to ask for two hours at a Tea. Norma explained that we had to charge that much because of the catering costs at the hotel.

Guest Gary Hallock spoke to us ahout the Annual Pun-Off. It takes place the first Sunday in May at the O. Henry Museum, and is their only fund raiser. The author O. Henry lived and wrote in Austin at the time that the Gilbert & Sullivan operas were first produced; he and his wife were members of a contemporary G&S Society. In view of this connection it seems appropriate to invite our Society to perform at this year's Pun-Off. Gary, as a member of the Pun-Off Board, officially asked that we consider preparing a

short, low-budget, low-key program of excerpts or scenes as warm up entertainment. A crowd of between 1,000 and 3,000 people usually attend the Pun-Off; this could be an excellent opportunity for us to publicize our June production of *Mikado*. We agreed to do it, and Bob K. and Anne will work on selecting material.

We spent the rest of the meeting discussing our ideas and goals for the Society. People have joined for a variety of reasons. Karen thinks most join to support production of Gilbert & Sullivan operas, and to receive the Newsletter which keeps them informed. A small minority are interested in performing, production or coming to meetings. She believes we need to solicit volunteers, and to make sure they have fun doing their jobs. We need more officers so that the work is spread out more.

Loel stated that the purpose of this organization is to have fun. He thinks we ought to get together and do a show at a church for our own pleasure. Robert Mellin said he believes that our purpose is to produce quality G&S.


