• Living Room Light Opera •

At a recent Society meeting I suggested transplanting a G&S activity that has been popular around New York. The Living Room Light Opera is based on one of the major forces that drives G&S enthusiasts after over 100 years: the pure pleasure of watching and participating in "such precious nonsense."

In order to give everybody an opportunity to share, LRLO would meet in member's homes to read through a designated G&S opera. The principals would be set in advance, on a volunteer basis, the rest would sing, hum, or think along as the chorus. The props and staging are entirely the responsibility of the individual. There is no rehearsal, and the outcome can range from sublime to absurd. It can be a polishing exercise for the potential star of our next stage production or a flyer on that part you really don't have the voice for. No one keeps score or makes judgments, unless they're compliments. Casting is based on first volunteer; talent is incidental; enthusiasm is mandatory; it's a blast.

In order to get started, we'll have to document our resources, including available scores, appropriate living rooms, accompanists (some talent required, virtuosity not mandatory; at least 2 per performance), interest (enthusiasm preferred), and ideas.

It is expected that our first "production" will be in the late summer. It will be *Trial By Jury* (we may do it twice) or *Iolanthe* (open to change under ideas, above). Please let's hear from you and help us jump start this fun activity for all of us.

Dorene is quite familiar with the publishing aspect, and Larry is in charge of gathering information. He had several questions about what we want, and Robert offered to meet with him later. It was suggested that the programs be printed on recycled paper, and all agreed.
- GSD&M Advertising Agency is working on designs for ads, T-Shirt logo, flyers, and the cover of the program, all free of charge. Thank you GSD&M!
- Through Katharine Shields, who sings in the choir at the University Methodist Church, Robert met the head honcho of the Aids Services of Austin. The result was an agreement for the Aids Services to buy the house on a Wednesday night early in the run of *The Mikado*. They will sell the tickets and take whatever profit they make.
- We discussed various options for the opening night Gala.
 Deborah will look into possibilities of getting a restaurant

to donate the food.

The **Pun-Off** went off as scheduled on Sunday, May 3rd. We opened the affair at about 12:30 pm, with half an hour of excerpts from *The Mikado*. Allen did a magnificent job as master of ceremonies and Singer of All Sorts of Parts. Bob Wall accompanied on the electronic keyboard, and the five singers cozied up to the microphones. This was a good thing since the Pecan Street Festival was in full swing all around us, and several loud bands were blasting away. Allen expressed his great appreciation to Bob Wall and the singers (all from the cast of *The Mikado*):

Christina Havenhill playing Yum-Yum, Martin Vasquez as Nanki-Poo, Blake Yelavich as Pish-Tush, and Frank Delvy as Pooh-Bah.

Allen opened with the *Mikado's* song "My object all sublime". There followed "Were you not to Ko-ko plighted", "I am so proud", and "Here's a howdy do", with a grand finale of all singing Anne Collins Smith's version of "I've got a little list" (as printed in the April Newsletter).

Anne was a contestant in the Pun-Off and reported that she made it through the first three Trials (out of four). Wow!

In New Business, Harold Gilbert presented a plan called The Living Room Light Opera. He has written it up and it appears on page 1 of this Newsletter. It sounds like what some people have been wanting for a long time.

We then adjourned for the usual goodies and sociability. The group was so small we sat around Pearl's ample dining table to eat and chat. Thank you, Pearl, as always!


