• Last Gathering and Musicale •

On Monday, March 1st, fifteen of us gathered at Pearl Amster's: members Frank and Donna Delvy, Michael Drousche, Reba Gillman, Loel Graber with guest Leslie Harper, Bob Greenwood, Enid Hallock, Janette Jones with guest Clare Hawkins, Bob Kusnetz, Robert Mellin, Bob Wall, and Jess and Emma Walters. Pearl Amster came home later. The evening began with a most unusual and exciting event, and if you weren't there you missed it!

Frank Delvy started things off with a stirring rendition of "I am a Pirate King" from *Pirates*. President Robert Mellin then gave us a brief update on *Iolanthe*: an *Iolanthe* had just been found (Carrie Skinner), a *Strephon* was still needed, more tenors are needed for the chorus. So is lots more money, although we made money on our December Fund Raiser, and individuals are contributing generously. Jess Walters and Janette Jones each contributed \$50 on the spot, and today we received the backing of Armstrong Moving and Storage to the tune of \$2500.

Reba passed around some cards and flyers received from Southwest Texas State University Music Department. These announced their production of *H.M.S. Pinafore*, April 28 - May 2, and June 4-6 in San Marcos. They are also planning a G&S Workshop July 7 - 21, 1993 which will culminate in a production of *The Mikado*. Call Reba at 327-2277 for more information. Bob Kusnetz reported G&S productions: *Iolanthe* in Atlanta, and *Patience* in Shreveport.

With Bob Wall at the piano, Janette Jones, Frank Delvy and Loel Graber took a variety of roles: "When Frederic was a little lad", Janette as Ruth in Pirates; "When Britain really ruled the waves", Loel as Lord Mountararat in Iolanthe; "When I went to the Bar as a very young man", Frank as the Lord Chancellor in *Iolanthe*; "Prithee pretty maiden", Loel and Janette as Grosvenor and Patience in *Patience*; "The law is the true embodiment of everything that's excellent", Frank as the Lord Chancellor joined by everyone as Peers, in Iolanthe; "Alone and yet alive", Janette as Katisha in Mikado; "There is beauty in the bellow of the blast", Janette and Frank as Katisha and Ko-Ko in Mikado; "You understand, I think I do", Frank and Loel as Richard and Despard in Ruddigore; "Love, unrequited, robs me of my rest" (also known as The Nightmare Song), Frank as the Lord Chancellor in Iolanthe; and finally "Never mind the why and wherefore" (The Bell Trio), sung by Janette, Frank and Loel as Josephine, the Captain, and Sir Joseph Porter in Pinafore.


