Last Gathering and Musicale

On Monday, April 12th, we gathered, 24 strong, at Pearl Amster's: members Pearl, Donna Delvy (Frank was at rehearsal and came in later for refreshments), Reba Gillman, Loel Graber, Bob Greenwood, Russell Gregory, Bill and Nan Hatcher with daughters Lisa and Lauren, Robert Mellin, Lucy Shoe Meritt, Jim Robinson, Katharine Shields, Diane Simpson, Isobel Stevenson, Bob Wall (valiant at the piano, as usual), Jess and Emma Walters, Terri Wilson, and Deborah Zallen. Guests were Jerry Conn, critic for the Westlake Picayune and performer in his own right; Jeanette Lay; and Paula Tyler, who is cultural arts coordinator for the program at the LBJ High School magnet school.

We started right off with a bang with Russell singing a mystery song, which turned out to be from *The Red Mill* by Victor Herbert (no wonder we couldn't place it!). After singing "A more humane Mikado" complete with blood-curdling laughter, Russell left us for another engagement. President Robert Mellin then brought us up to date on *Iolanthe*. Robert then introduced Jim Robinson and Katharine Shields who were to provide the rest of the musical entertainment. They started with a duet from *Iolanthe*, "None shall part us". Then Jim sang "Is there not one maiden breast" from *Pirates*, with the ladies joining in enthusiastically on the choruses. Katharine sang "The sun whose rays" from *The Mikado*, and they finished up with the duet, "Oh love, true love" from *The Sorcerer*. Katharine remarked that they had sung these parts together a long time ago in our first production of *The Sorcerer* (November 1977).

We then paused for introductions all around. Jess Walters was prevailed upon to sing "When I, good friends, was called to the Bar" from *Trial By Jury*. Jim Robinson, who is a member of the Houston G&S Society, announced that their annual production this summer will be *Pirates*, opening on July 16. Alistair Donkin, from the former D'Oyly Carte company, will play the Major General. By request Robert explained the plot of *Iolanthe*.
