# Gilbert & Sullivan Convention Report by Reba Gillman

The Convention was successful although modest, and the Saturday evening entertainment was very well attended. Most of the events took place in the Austin Scottish Rite Temple. Its white stucco, mostly windowless exterior, houses a Victorian interior very friendly to Gilbert & Sullivan. A large hall with wood paneling and polished parquet floors, comfortably furnished with leather chairs and couches, served as the Friday night meeting place and the intermission space Saturday. A pleasing array of photos and posters had been mounted there by Historian Libby Weed, as well as the usual display of G&S cards, T-Shirts, and Harry Benford Lexicons, which we offered for sale. We also sold posters, and played a video tape of our 1995 production of Gondoliers. Proudly displayed were two proclamations: one from Governor George W. Bush, and the other from the Austin City Council, naming December 1 through 3, Gilbert and Sullivan Weekend. A large room in the basement afforded classroom-like accommodations for the Saturday afternoon Trivia Quiz. The pleasant theater, seating over 250 people, was available for musical activities and was filled for the Saturday night Holiday Season All-Star Revue, and Trial by Jury.

#### **Events**

Friday, December 1, 1995 at 7 pm • An informal gathering to discuss organizational matters, attended by 10 people. Present from the G&S Society of Austin were President Robert Mellin, Secretary Reba Gillman, Treasurer Bill Hatcher, and Historian-Parliamentarian Libby Weed. The Houston G&S Society was represented by Jim Robinson, who is a member of their Board but lives in Austin and is also a member of the Austin Society, and Ron Hamilton, a singer and Board member. Dallas was represented by Marian Shulman, Founder and Director of the Texas Gilbert & Sullivan Company, her husband Arthur. and Harriet Langston, singer and Board member. Betty Switzer of the Texas Commission on the Arts (TCA) was the invited speaker. She addressed our funding concerns forthrightly, and explained the mandate for diversity and equity the Commission operates under. She urged us to keep applying for grants, and gave us sound advice on how to explain our mission in specific terms the Commission could relate to. We also exchanged some information on the operation of each group represented, and discussed ways of improving communication among us.

Afterward we gathered around the piano in the lobby of Cambridge Tower, across the street, for informal singing.

- 2) Saturday, December 2, 1 3 pm G&S Trivia Contest, planned and presided over by Gary Hallock. This was great fun, and was enjoyed by about 30 people, most of them from the Texas G&S Company of Dallas.
- 3) Saturday, 3 4 pm A session to learn a Gilbert and Sullivan choral ensemble, directed by Eric Moellering, Conductor, and accompanied by pianist JoAnn Brubaker, both of the Texas G&S Company from Dallas. The ensemble from *Patience* was the one that begins with the lovesick maidens singing "In a doleful train Two and two we walk all day", continues with the dragoons singing "Now is not this ridiculous, and is not this preposterous?" and culminates with the magnificent counterpoint of both groups singing together.
- 4) Saturday, 4 5 pm Master class, conducted by Edward Baird, Professor of Music and Director of Graduate Studies for the College of Music at the University of North Texas. He is also active as a stage director, conductor, clinician, and adjuducator, and played the part of The Judge in the evening performance of *Trial by Jury*. Many thanks to the singers who participated in the master class; they were Amy Baker, from our Holiday Revue, and Harriet Langston who played first Bridesmaid in the Dallas performance of *Trial by Jury*. It was an interesting and rewarding session.
- 5) Saturday, 7:30 pm Another One Time Only Holiday Season All-Star Revue, performed by the Gilbert & Sullivan Society of Austin; and *Trial by Jury*, performed by The Texas Gilbert & Sullivan Company, from Dallas. After the show all adjourned to Cambridge Tower across the street, for the Gala Champagne Buffet.
- 6) Sunday, December 3, 10:30 am Sing Through of *The Pirates of Penzance*, attended by President Robert Mellin and some of the Texas Gilbert & Sullivan Company. Our Michael McKelvey directed and JoAnn Brubaker from Dallas accompanied the singing.
