Message from your President

Several members took me up on my request for calls expressing your concerns and interests, and I found this helpful and encouraging. It is very important that we have a board responsive to the membership of our society, so I urge all of you to feel free to call me at any time or to visit with me at one of the monthly musicales.

If you have been a part of the Gilbert & Society of Austin for any time at all, you are aware of what an important part secretary Reba Gillman plays in our organization. But perhaps not everyone is aware of what a real jewel we have in our midst in Reba. Her recent nomination for the "Five Who Care" Community Service Awards sponsored by KVUE television here in Austin provides a golden opportunity to bring this to light.

Reba joined our society in 1978, and has served as secretary in 1980 and again from 1984 to the present (in which capacity, I might add, she writes one of the most interesting and literate newsletters to be found anywhere!). In the intervening period, 1981 through 1983, she was our president. She appeared in productions of *Iolanthe*, *Patience*, *Scenes* (from various operas), *Trial by Jury*, *Gondoliers*, and *Ruddigore* during the years from 1978 through 1985. Her husband, Dr. Leonard Gillman (professor emeritus, UT department of mathematics) has also served in many important ways over the years, providing artistic and organizational leadership. Look at Reba's personalized license plate or listen to her talk about the Savoy Operas and you will know that, as she says, she "bleeds Gilbert and Sullivan."


But Reba's community service goes far beyond her profound contributions to our efforts. For many years she worked with the Austin Community Nursery Schools, a worthy organization that provides high quality child care for low-income families. She served as a teacher, supervisor of teachers, educational coordinator, and teacher trainer. She retired as Educational Director in 1990 and still serves on the ACNS board. She also serves as a volunteer for Literacy Austin, tutoring adults.

One of the most fascinating items in her marvelous vita dates back to her years in Indiana (before New Jersey, which was before New York, which was before Austin), where she created and taught for six years a course in Music for Young Children at Purdue University. How I would enjoy sitting in on such a course!
