Jeffrey M. Jones, our Music Director, is a doctoral student in Choral Conducting at UT, and also a tenor. He played the part of Luiz last year in our *Gondoliers*, and was the Music Director for our 1994 production of *Pinafore*, for which he was nominated for an ACOT B. Iden Payne Award as Best Music Director. He is Music Director for the Capitol City Men's Chorus.

Andrea Ariel, our Choreographer, is the Artistic Director of Ariel Dance Theatre. Her work has been presented throughout Texas, and in California, Illinois, and New Mexico. She was the Choreographer of our production of *Gondoliers* last year.

Michael J. Smith, our Set Designer, was Technical Director at St. Stephens, while he taught Biology there. He has since designed sets and lighting, and served as Technical Director in several Austin theaters.

Member of the Executive Board Chris Buggé is serving as the dialect coach for *Pirates*.

On Monday April 1, 1996 at 7:30 pm 31 people signed in at Pearl's. Present were members Pearl Amster, Byron Arnason, Chris & Jean Buggé with baby Domenic, "Deacon" Crain, Loel Graber, Chuck Kraus, Bob Kusnetz, Allen Lawshae, Robert Mellin, Kay Novak, Maurie Ommerman, Bee Harris Palomé, Larry Shepley, Dan Smith, Lydia Storey, Lord High Pianist Bob Wall, Jess & Emma Walters, Libby Weed, and Theresa Wilson, and new members Marilyn Babcock and Joyce & George John. Guests were Tim Campbell, Moise Levy, Eldon Little, Barbara Mjas, Bob Nelson, Susan Peisl, and Amy Baker Stinson.

Bob Nelson broke the ice with "Old Man River" which is not, as Bob Kusnetz suggested, from Ruddigore and Bess - it's from the G&S musical Showboat. As usual Bob Wall played the piano (and did it very well).

President Libby Weed reported that the Board is very active this year, and introduced the few of us who were there! She particularly complimented Reba Gillman for her nomination for Five Who Care [someone else actually won]. Several items under consideration by the Board include ticket structure and publicity. Libby also thanked those who have called to give input, and encouraged more such calls.

Robert Mellin announced that our past president Bob Kusnetz is going to be our first Life Member - make that Lord High Life Member - in honor of his donation of \$2,500, which will be matched by his employer IBM, for a total of \$5,000. Robert then gave an update on the casting for *Pirates*. 75 to 80 people came out for the auditions, and the show could have been cast twice over because so many very good people had to be turned down. With a few parts still open we have possibly the best cast we've ever had, and Robert anticipated a wonderful production. [See cast list in preceding column.]

Robert then introduced our stage director, also a tenor, Tim Campbell, who is a doctoral candidate at UT Austin, and who recently directed the fine production of Baroque and Loving It. Tim then sang "Stranger in Paradise" (Kismet) and offered to do a couple of other songs (which he did later, so popular was he!). Bob Kusnetz, who had never sung with an accompanist before, sang "My name is John Wellington Wells" (Sorcerer). He is getting married, will be out of town for a couple of months, and then will move to Minneapolis - so this is probably his last meeting.

Loel Graber sang "When Britain really ruled the waves" (Iolanthe). Tim Campbell sang "Thine is My Heart Alone" ("Dein ist Mein Ganzes Herz") from Land of Smiles by Lehar. Dan Smith sang "I've Grown Accustomed to Her Face" from My Fair Lady. (Cont.p 3)

(Cont. from p 2) Amy Baker Stinson, recognizing that most of the songs so far were non G&S, sang a recital song, "One Perfect Rose" with Eldon Little at the piano. The music is by Seymour Barab, and the words are the famous poem by Dorothy Parker. Amy also sang "The sun whose rays are all ablaze" (Mikado), with Bob Wall again playing the piano.

Robert Mellin mentioned that Jess Walters recently sang in the UT voice faculty program "An Evening of Opera and Song", where he stole the show. Jess remarked that he'll never give it back. Bob Nelson, our Sergeant, sang "When a felon's not engaged in his employment" from Pirates. Tim Campbell returned with "Sit Down, You're Rocking the Boat" (Guys and Dolls). Chris Buggé introduced his son (number three, born November 6) Domenic.

Allen Lawshae led off with "Although our dark career Sometimes involves the crime of stealing ... For what, we ask, is life Without a touch of Poetry in it?" and everyone joined in singing "Hail Poetry" (*Pirates*). Everyone then sang "Now to the banquet we press" (*Sorcerer*) and then pressed on to the banquet.

Note from Secretary Reba Gillman: Andrea Ariel, our Choreographer, came to this gathering after attending a conflicting rehearsal. Busy Jeffrey Jones was unable to be present, due to a rehearsal of his Capitol City Men's Chorus. Many thanks to Larrry Shepley who took these notes while I was gallivanting around Tucson, AZ.


