#### Message from Your President

One of the best things that Robert Mellin did for our Society was to introduce Rafe MacPhail to us and to persuade him to become our director for *The Mikado*. As you may know, Rafe is a traditionalist (with perhaps a few, but very few, modernist touches); no Japanese gentlemen clutching lap-tops nor intrusions from *The Pirates of Penzance* for us! Just a great show as G&S themselves would have liked, and as G&S knew would be a great success. Rafe, last year, did his magic (he is, after all, a magician on the side) for *Patience*. I was out of town until after the roof caved in at the Helm Fine Arts Center, so I only saw *Patience* in St. Stephen's gym — but it, too, was fresh, musical, traditional, and most of all entertaining.

Professor Ralph MacPhail, Jr., to be formal, is on the faculty at an excellent liberal arts college, Bridgewater College, in Virginia (although he holds a Texas driver's license, through some rather Gilbertian circumstances). He is used to dealing with all kinds of people, including students, and I presume their parents, plus colleagues and even administrators. I am especially looking forward to *H.M.S. Pinafore*, which he will direct, along with Jeffrey Jones-Ragona, our musical director of rather long standing. Both Rafe and Jeffrey drive the performers hard and exact only the best from them — under the circumstances, it is amazing how well liked they are by the company.

And our next Musicale will be an unusual lecture and discussion headed by Rafe, an event you will not want to miss. Rafe knows all about G&S, and better, can talk about it most entertainingly. All of our Musicales are free, so here is your chance to learn something, to enjoy a nice Sunday afternoon, and remeet your G&S Society friends. Oh yes, here, too, is your chance to take a look at the newly opened Mary Ann Heller Opera Center, where festivities will take place in the Preece Recital Hall starting at 4:30 pm on Sunday June 4.

#### Last Musicale

On Monday May 1, 2000, we gathered at Paula Tyler's home for a taste of *Pinafore*, and a charming presentation by 14 fifth graders from Kay Greenhaw's music class at Doss Elementary School.

To start things off President Larry Shepley introduced Janette Jones, who plays Little Buttercup in our production of *Pinafore*. She gave us a brief outline of the story and launched into the well-known song, "I'm called Little Buttercup," in which Buttercup sells her wares to the sailors aboard the good ship Pinafore. We were happy to have our trusty Lord High Pianist Bob Wall at the piano. Jim Hunter then stepped forward as Sir Joseph Porter, KCB, the First Lord of the Admiralty. He explained that to understand Sir Joseph you should think of him as being the superintendent of the AISD. He then sang "When I was a lad," in which Sir Joseph explains how he got to his exalted rank, and gives the advice "Stick close to your desks and never go to sea, And you all may be rulers of the Queen's Navee." Brian Gaston, our General Manager and Producer, explained that several other members of the cast had been scheduled to appear, but were tied up in rehearsal.

Larry then introduced Carrie Hays and Kay Greenhaw, with their pianist Dr. Larry Lake (UT Professor of Petroleum Engineering). Carrie proceeded to read us the synopsis of their seriously comic opera Aida Spaghetti, while their enthusiastic students performed at the appropriate moments. This opera consists of new words set to familiar tunes, mostly from Gilbert and Sullivan, with a touch of Verdi, Wagner, Rossini, and Bizet, strung together on an ingenius and novel plot, all invented by Carrie and Kay. My favorite was "I am the very model of a Pizza Shop Proprietor," which was spit out with clarity and confidence by the young patter singer. We all enjoyed the kids' obvious delight in the clever words and tuneful music. This is one very effective way to ensure a continuing audience for the Gilbert and Sullivan operas - hook'em while they're young! We thank Bee Polomé who alerted us to this group. She learned of them when they performed at school with a small orchestra in which she played the viola.

To round out the evening Jim Hunter sang the familiar Pirate King lead in and we all rose to sing "Hail Poetry" (*Pirates*), followed by an enthusiastic "Now to the banquet we press" (*Sorcerer*). There followed munching and chatting with our young guest performers.
