


Letter from Your President

Musicale to Open the Season

On Monday September 13th we gathered at the beautiful home of Benny and Nancy Jay to open this year's season. President Bill Hatcher welcomed us, and thanked the Jays for their hospitality. Bill urged us to attend the concert version of *Patience*, coming up in November. He thanked Libby Weed for planning the program and turned matters over to her.

Libby took the stage with her usual interesting remarks and introductions. First, she asked that members identify their guests. Allan Longacre introduced his new relations Dick and Ethel Harvey, who now live half the year in Austin and half in Israel. Their son married the Longacres' daughter. Byron Arneson, whose enthusiasm for our Society and Gilbert and Sullivan causes him to bring many friends to our events, introduced Pat Hobbes. Vivian Mansell told us that she had enjoyed attending our last two events and was now becoming a member. Reba introduced her daughter Miki Gillman, visiting from California, and noted that over the years Miki had followed her mom's performances in Gilbert and Sullivan, and also appeared many years ago in Indiana as an under-age bridesmaid in *Trial by Jury*.

Libby explained that the program was in two parts. For Act I the singers chose a song from their repertory — the attraction here is that they can sing music they don't usually have the opportunity to sing. Act II concentrated on G&S. Libby introduced our fine pianist, Gloria Kim, to open the program. Gloria is a candidate for a graduate degree in Music at UT. She has studied with organist Frank Speller and pianist Gregory Allen. She also worked with Daniele Martin, the U.T. Professor of Piano who died tragically in April 2004. "Glorious Gloria" as Dani Martin had dubbed her, played a Chopin Nocturne and dedicated her performance to her grandparents and to Professor Martin. There followed a delightful evening with some of our favorite performers. We ended up as usual all joining in to sing "Hail Poetry," with Brad Merrell singing the Pirate King's lead in; "Now to the banquet we press" was then the signal to adjourn to the Jay's glamorous kitchen to partake of the good cheer and friendly conversation.
