
Please bring munchies.

Some Victorians objected that the title was too gory for respectable families. Of course, the music is fun, the lyrics delightfully witty, and the story is upside-down and even a bit sideways. He will lead a sing-a-long with one of G&S's most famous — and most difficult — patter songs.

To participate, people need to sign up for the Winter semester of the program, which has a fee; the program entitles registrants to four classes of their choice and runs for six Wednesdays from 9:15–3:15. Each class is about 90 minutes long. The term begins on January 10, the last class being on February 14.
