

A Note from the Director

Welcome to The Sorcerer in Concert 2022!

When GSA Board President Diane Radin asked me to direct this production, I was thrilled and said yes immediately. Performing an opera in concert presents challenges that one doesn't face in a fully staged production, and I set to work to create, for what has turned out to be our first return to live performance in two years, a production that would showcase our wonderful performers and the music—which by definition is the raison d'etre of any concert performance.

Something new was called for as well, so I decided to transport the English villagers to modern day Las Vegas, to Marmaduke Pointdextre's glamorous Palace Casino and Showroom (complete with Elvis Wedding Chapel!) where they will attend a wedding and take in a world-famous magician's act!

This also presented the opportunity to add some pieces—one new, the other not heard in 20 years—to the concert: Lady Sangazure's air in Act I, and the "Ahrimanes scene" in Act II. Both of these were cut from the original London production. We have Sir William Gilbert's lyrics, but no music for them is known to have survived. Tonight you will see both scenes, Lady Sangazure's air as composed by William Clark Snyder (a real showpiece, first heard in our 2001 production, directed by G'Ann Boyd) and the Summoning of Demon Ahrimanes, with music by David C. Larrick, which has never been performed in Texas. Instead of the overture arranged for piano, I've invited our pianist, Joseph Choi, to perform as a prelude a piano piece that 19th century audiences would have recognized and loved. He has chosen Chopin's Scherzo in D-flat Major, and performs this beloved masterpiece brilliantly.

After such a long absence from ... well, everything, my main goal was to present something different and enjoyable, in which the voices and the music would, quite literally, take center stage all evening long. Plus—we're in Vegas, so everyone has an excuse to put on their best, most glamorous evening attire and get noticed! So sit back, relax, and settle in for some remarkably beautiful singing, beautiful music, and a most charming evening out in one of the world's great entertainment capitals. Welcome back to the theatre!

The Story

At the Palace Showroom and Casino, owner Marmaduke Poindexter (a former mob boss turned "legitimate businessman") has gathered friends to take in a magic show by world-famous magician JW Wells and attend the wedding of his son Alexis and Aline Sangazure (presided over by the Elvis-impersonating justice Dr. Daly). In this happy atmosphere, the sad air of unrequited love hangs a bit heavily: Ms. Partlet (a retired showgirl, now casino greeter) encourages her daughter, Constance (an aspiring lounge singer) in her affections for Dr. Daly, who is unaware of her feelings even after several strong hints. Marmaduke and Lady Sangazure (a world famous singer, now retired from the stage) clearly carry torches for each other, but are too shy to make their feelings known. Alexis, wanting everyone to know the joy of love as he and Aline share, decides to make a present of a "love philtre"—obtained from JW Wells, who has more magical powers than most are aware—to his guests. The promised result: all who take it shall fall into a deep sleep, and upon awakening, fall in love with the first person they see. What could possibly go wrong?




